[Note- May 15, 2023 is the earliest date that a constituent school board may designate its representative and identify the candidates that the Board supports] and

WHEREAS, Section 614(2) of the Revised School Code prescribes the method for adoption of a resolution including the requirement that the resolution be considered at not less than one public meeting before the board adopts the resolution, and

WHEREAS, the board previously considered this resolution at an open meeting conducted in accordance with the requirements of the Open Meetings Act on May 22, 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1.	The Board designates Tosh Perry as its representative to serve on the 2023 electoral body responsible for electing members to the Lenawee Intermediate School District Board of Education and Dan Paterson as alternate representative in the event the designated representative is unable to attend the election.
2.	The Board supports candidate(s) David Pray & Paula Hold [insert two candidate names, which is equal to the number of vacancies] for a position on the Lenawee Intermediate School District Board of Education for a full-term of six years beginning on July 1, 2023.
3.	The Board directs its representative, Tobb Porry, to cast the Board's vote for candidate(s) David Pray & Paula Holtz, [insert two candidate names, which is equal to the number of vacancies] at least on the first ballot taken at the June 5, 2023, election.
4.	The Board authorizes and directs its secretary to file this resolution with the secretary of the Lenawee Intermediate School District Board of Education.
