We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-2016 educational progress for Addison High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability and teacher quality. The key initiatives being undertaken to accelerate student achievement and/or close persistent achievement gaps are:
1) Development of an academic intervention class that assists students with missing assignments.
2) The creation of a seminar class where all students can go to teachers in the subject areas that they are struggling in to get extra help.
3) Special Education teachers Co-Teaching in core classrooms.

Our High School enrolls 259 students grades 9–12. In addition to our standard class offerings consistent with the Common Core State Standards, we offer Pre-Calculus, AP Classes, physics, Dual Enrollment, and various other STEM offerings. We offer on-line courses, and opportunities to train for careers through the Lenawee County Career Technical Center and Southern Michigan Science and Industry.

Our High School has established a positive school climate with the implementation of the Essential 10, which is a shorten version of the Ron Clark Essential 55 behavior rules. Our Student Leadership groups partner with fellow students and professional staff to create a school climate which embraces respect and excellence. We have a successful athletic program featuring Football, Cross Country, Bowling, Volleyball, Basketball, Softball, Baseball, Competitive Cheer and Track.

State Law requires that we also report the following additional information.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL: Addison High Schools has one school for grades 9–12 assigning students based upon age, grade level or accumulated credits.

THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN: Addison High School is in its' third year of the District 3–5 year plan. The 2015–2016 school year will see the evaluation of the school improvement plan.

A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF EACH SPECIALIZED SCHOOL: The LISD TECH Center offers career technical education programs for high school juniors and seniors. 59 students from Addison attended the LISD TECH Center or participated in the co-op/work experience program during 2015-16. This equals 39% of the junior and senior population for this school district.

The LISD PREP Academy provides educational programs for teen parents from Lenawee County. During the student's instructional program, childcare support is provided. 2 students from Addison attended the LISD PREP Academy during the 2015-16 school year.

A copy of the Core Curriculum can also be located at the Michigan Department of Education web-site at: www.michigan.gov. The Common Core Curriculum is fully implemented, which is the State model. Each teacher incorporates the standards into daily lesson plans. There are no variances from the State model as Addison has fully embraced implementation of the Common Core State Standards. The Science department is implementing the Next Generation Standards, with the Social Studies implementing State Standards.

IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES: There are 256 students enrolled in the high school (18%) of the parents attended the parent teacher conferences.

THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF POST SECONDARY ENROLLMENTS (DUAL ENROLLMENT): There were 20 (7%) students enrolled in postsecondary courses known as dual enrollment.

NUMBER OF COLLEGE EQUIVALENT COURSES OFFERED (AP/IB): Addison offers one Siena Heights Biology course on campus taught by an Addison teacher. Jackson College, Baker College, Hillsdale College, Adrian and Spring Arbor are colleges in which students may enroll.

THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS ENROLLED IN COLLEGE OR EQUIVALENT COURSES (AP/IB): During the 2015–2016 school year we had 20 (7%) of our students enrolled in college equivalent classes.

THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGES OF STUDENTS RECEIVING A SCORE LEADING TO COLLEGE CREDIT: During the 2015–2016 school year we had 19 (7%) of our students received a score leading to college credit.
