Dear Parent/Guardian,

We have been notified of a Positive COVID-19 student within **Addison Elementary**. We have worked with the Lenawee County Health Department (LCHD) to ensure that close contacts are identified and appropriate actions are taken.

- **Students in Mrs. Spink's class have been identified as close contacts.**
- **These students will need to be home quarantined for a total of 14 days past the last time they were exposed to the person with COVID-19.**
- Students may return to school and normal activities on **Date: Tuesday, March 2, 2021**

QUARANTINE

Quarantine is an important step in preventing the spread of COVID-19. People placed in quarantine must stay home, separate themselves from others if possible, and monitor for any symptoms of COVID-19. When feasible, they should use a designated area of the home, including restroom facilities, that no one else should enter or use. Contact tracers will be following up with you on behalf of your child by phone during his/her quarantine. If your child develops any symptoms consistent with COVID-19, please call your child's healthcare provider as well as the school. Symptoms of COVID-19 may include: fever/chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle/body aches, headache, new loss of taste/smell, sore throat, congestion/runny nose, nausea/vomiting, or diarrhea.

TESTING

Anyone with symptoms should be tested. Even if your child does not have symptoms, though, you can still have them tested. **Please note, if your child tests negative, he/she will still have to complete the rest of the quarantine period and continue to monitor for symptoms.**
